VISUAL ARTS

Effective **September 1, 2013**, the Department of Visual Arts will revise its modules.

HONORS SPECIALIZATION IN ART HISTORY AND CRITICISM

Admission Requirements

Completion of first-year requirements with no failures. Students must have an average of at least 70% in 3.0 principal courses, including 1.0 course from either Visual Arts History 1040 or two of VAH 1041F/G, VAH 1042F/G, VAH 1043F/G, VAH 1044F/G or VAH 1045F/G plus 2.0 additional courses, with no mark in these principal courses below 60%.

HONORS SPECIALIZATION IN VISUAL ARTS

Admission Requirements

Completion of first-year requirements with no failures. Students must have an average of at least 70% in 3.0 principal courses, including Visual Arts Studio 1020 or VAS 1025 and 1.0 course from either Visual Arts History 1040 or two of VAH 1041A/B, VAH 1042A/B, VAH 1043A/B, VAH 1044A/B and VAH1045 A/B plus 1.0 additional course, with no mark in these principal courses below 60%.

BACHELOR OF FINE ARTS, HONORS SPECIALIZATION IN STUDIO ARTS

Admission Requirements

Completion of first-year requirements with no failures. Students must have an average of at least 70% in 3.0 principal courses including:

- Visual Arts Studio 1025 or VAS 1020;
- 1.0 course from either Visual Arts History 1040 or two of VAH 1041A/B, VAH 1042A/B, VAH 1043A/B, VAH 1044A/B and VAH 1045A/B, and
- 1.0 additional course. There may be no mark less than 70% in either VAS 1025 or VAS 1020 and no mark less than 60% in VAH 1040 and the 1.0 additional principal course.

MAJOR IN VISUAL ARTS

Admission Requirements

Completion of first-year requirements, including Visual Arts Studio 1020 or VAS 1025 and 1.0 course from either Visual Arts History 1040 or two of VAH 1041A/B, VAH 1042A/B, VAH 1043A/B, VAH 1044A/B and VAH 1045A/B, with a mark of at least 60% in each course, or permission of the Department.

MAJOR IN MUSEUM AND CURATORIAL STUDIES

Admission Requirements

Completion of first-year requirements, including 1.0 course from either Visual Arts History 1040 or two of VAH 1041A/B, VAH 1042A/B, VAH 1043A/B, VAH 1044A/B and VAH 1045A/B, and one of Visual Arts Studio 1020 or Visual Arts Studio 1025, with a mark of at least 60% in each course.

SPECIALIZATION IN VISUAL ARTS

Admission Requirements

Completion of first-year requirements, including Visual Arts Studio 1020 or Visual Arts Studio 1025 and 1.0 course from either Visual Arts History 1040 or two of VAH 1041A/B, VAH 1042A/B, VAH 1043A/B, VAH

1044A/B and VAH 1045A/B, with a mark of at least 60% in each course, or permission of the Department.

MINOR IN VISUAL ARTS

Admission Requirements

Completion of first-year requirements, including Visual Arts Studio 1020 or Visual Arts Studio 1025 and 1.0 course from either Visual Arts History 1040 or two of VAH 1041A/B, VAH 1042A/B, VAH 1043A/B, VAH 1044A/B and VAH 1045A/B, with a mark of at least 60% in each course, or permission of the Department.

MINOR IN MUSEUM AND CURATORIAL STUDIES

Admission Requirements

Completion of first-year requirements, including Visual Arts Studio 1020 or Visual Arts Studio 1025 and 1.0 course from either Visual Arts History 1040 or two of VAH 1041A/B, VAH 1042A/B, VAH 1043A/B, VAH 1044A/B and VAH 1045A/B, with a mark of at least 60%, or permission of the Department.

FACULTY OF SCIENCE

EARTH SCIENCES

Effective **September 1, 2013**, the following changes are required to the Admission requirements of the HSP in Environmental Geoscience module.

HONORS SPECIALIZATION IN ENVIRONMENTAL GEOSCIENCE

Admission Requirements

Completion of first-year requirements with no failures. Students must have a minimum average of at least 70% in 3.0 principal courses, with a minimum of 60% in each of the principal courses taken, including:

Biology 1001A or 1201A and 1002B or 1202B or the former Biology 1222, 1223;

Chemistry 1301A/B and 1302A/B or 1100A/B and 1200B or the former Chemistry 1050;

Plus 1.0 additional course from: Calculus 1000A/B or 1500A/B, or the former Calculus 1100A/B, and one of Applied Mathematics 1201A/B or the former Calculus 1201A/B, Calculus 1301A/B or 1501A/B, Mathematics 1225A/B, 1228A/B, 1229A/B or 1600A/B or the former Linear Algebra 1600A/B, Statistical Sciences 1024A/B; or Mathematics 1225A/B and 1229A/B, Applied Mathematics 1201A/B or the former Calculus 1100A/B or 1201A/B, Linear Algebra 1600A/B. This requirement must be completed by the end of second year.

FACULTY OF SOCIAL SCIENCE

ECONOMICS

Effective **September 1, 2013**, the prerequisites for Economics 2122A/B, 2150A/B and 2152A/B will be revised as follows. The prerequisite changes are the only revisions to these courses.

Economics 2122A/B – Econometrics I

Economics 2150A/B – Intermediate Microeconomic Theory I

Economics 2152A/B – Intermediate Macroeconomic Theory and Policy I

Prerequisite(s): Economics 1021A/B and 1022A/B, or Economics 1020 or 2001A/B, and one of MCV4U, Mathematics 0110A/B, Calculus 1000A/B, Mathematics 1225A/B or the former Calculus 1100A/B.

GEOGRAPHY

Effective **September 1, 2013**, the prerequisites for Geography 2460F/G be revised.

Geography 2460F/G - Introduction to Urban Development

Growth, structure and morphology in industrial and post-industrial cities; theories of, and empirical research on, urban form and structure; land development decision making; development feasibility modelling; urban land-use policy.

Prerequisite(s): 1.0 course from Geography 1100, 1300A/B, 1400F/G, 1500F/G, 2131A/B, 2153A/B (taken after September 2012), or the former Geography 020E, or Economics 1021A/B or 1022A/B, or enrollment in any of the Global Development Studies or Globalization Studies modules
3 lecture hours, 0.5 course.

MANAGEMENT AND ORGANIZATIONAL STUDIES

Effective **September 1, 2013**, the prerequisites for MOS 2199Y, 3199Y, 4199Y, 3305F/G, 3306F/G, 4405F/G, 4406F/G, and 4409F/G will be updated with the new Geography and Commercial Aviation module. The prerequisite changes are the only revisions to these courses.

Management and Organizational Studies 2199Y - Professional Pilot Academic Internship I

Prerequisite(s): Restricted to students registered in 2nd year of the Flight Training option of the Commercial Aviation Management module of BMOS or Geography and Commercial Aviation Management module.

Management and Organizational Studies 3199Y - Professional Pilot Academic Internship II

Prerequisite(s): MOS 2199Y and registration in 3rd year of the Flight training option of the Commercial Aviation Management module of BMOS or Geography and Commercial Aviation Management module.

Management and Organizational Studies 3305A/B - Human Factors in Aviation

Prerequisite(s): Enrollment in 3rd or 4th year of the Commercial Aviation Management module of BMOS or Geography and Commercial Aviation Management module.

Management and Organizational Studies 3306A/B - Aviation Law

Prerequisite(s): Enrollment in 3rd or 4th year of the Commercial Aviation Management module of BMOS or Geography and Commercial Aviation Management module.

Management and Organizational Studies 4199Y - Professional Pilot Academic Internship III

Prerequisite(s): MOS 3199Y and enrollment in 4th year of the Flight Training option of the Commercial Aviation Management module of BMOS or Geography and Commercial Aviation Management module.

Management and Organizational Studies 4405F/G - Airport Planning and Management

Prerequisite(s): Enrollment in 4th year of the Commercial Aviation Management module of BMOS or Geography and Commercial Aviation Management module.

Management and Organizational Studies 4406F/G - Airline Operation and Management

Prerequisite(s): Enrollment in 4th year of the Commercial Aviation Management module of BMOS or Geography and Commercial Aviation Management module.

Management and Organizational Studies 4409F/G - Aviation Safety

Prerequisite(s): MOS 1022F/G and enrollment in 4th year of the Commercial Aviation Management module of BMOS or Geography and Commercial Aviation Management module.

Students must have an average of at least 70% in 3.0 principal courses, including 1.0 course from English 1020E or 1022E or 1024E or 1035E or 1036E or both of English 1027F/G and 1028F/G or English 1901E plus 2.0 additional courses, with no mark in these principal courses below 60%.

1.0 course from: English at the 2200 level and above. Up to 1.0 essay course may be substituted from any 2000-2199 level English course. (Students are strongly encouraged to take either English 3554E or 3557F/G.) English essay course at the 2000 level or above.

Note: English 2017 and Speech 2001 may not be counted toward the Honors Specialization in English. French or a foreign language is recommended for students intending to apply to graduate schools or professional programs.

MAJOR IN ENGLISH LANGUAGE AND LITERATURE**Admission Requirements**

Completion of first-year requirements, including 1.0 from English 1020E or 1022E or 1024E or 1035E or 1036E or both of English 1027F/G and 1028F/G or English 1901E with a mark of at least 60%. Students will be eligible for an Honors BA with double major if they obtain 70% average in the courses of each major module with no mark less than 60% in each course. No failures on options.

Admission Requirements

Completion of first-year requirements, including 1.0 from English 1020E or 1022E or 1024E or 1035E or 1036E or both of English 1027F/G and 1028F/G or English 1901E, with a mark of at least 60%. Students should consult with the Department prior to admission.

Completion of first-year requirements, including 1.0 from English 1020E or 1022E or 1024E or 1035E or 1036E or both of English 1027F/G and 1028F/G or English 1901E, with a mark of at least 60%. Students should consult with the Department prior to admission.

Note: English 2017 and Speech 2001 may not be counted toward the Minor in English for Teachers.

Admission Requirements

Completion of first-year requirements, including 1.0 from English 1020E or 1022E or 1024E or 1035E or 1036E or both of (English 1027F/G and 1028F/G) or English 1901E, with a mark of at least 60%. Students should consult with the Department prior to admission.

English 2017 (117) may be counted toward the Minor in General English if the course was taken prior to summer 2007. With this one exception, English 2017 (117) does not meet any of the requirements of any English modules. Speech 2001 (143) may not be counted towards the Minor in General English.~~
