# **Dentistry 5395: Operative Dentistry** (section 003 ITD students only)

A study of the clinical application of various restorative treatment techniques and procedures involved in the management of hard tissue lesions emphasizing a biological approach to general restorative dentistry. 6 lecture hours; 30 lab hours (Total 32 36 hours)

# Dentistry 5398: Endodontics (section 003 ITD students only)

This course in Endodontics is designed for the first year students in the Internationally Trained Dentists (ITD) Program. It will cover both didactic material and the preclinical laboratory simulations that are provided to Year II (D5228) and Year III (D5328) of the DDS Program at Western.
