FILM STUDIES

Effective September 1, 2014, the Faculty of Arts and Humanities will introduce Film Studies 1022.

Film Studies 1022: Introduction to Film Studies

What is a blockbuster? What is a cult film? What is digital cinema? Discover the answers to these questions and others in a broad introduction to the study of cinema. Students will learn the basic vocabulary of film studies and gain an informed understanding of the different critical approaches to film analysis. Antirequisite(s): Film Studies 1020E

5 hours including screening, 1.0 course

HONORS SPECIALIZATION IN FILM STUDIES

The Minor in Film Studies is intended for students who want a rigorous program of film study compatible with potential upgrading to Major and Honors Specialization modules in Film Studies.

Admission Requirements

Completion of first-year requirements, including Film Studies 1020E or Film Studies 1022 with a mark of at least 60%.

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MINOR IN GENERAL CINEMA STUDIES

The Minor in General Cinema Studies is intended for students who want a general program of film study with maximum choice and flexibility. Students who might consider upgrading to Major and Honors Specialization modules in Film Studies should take the Minor in Film Studies.

Admission Requirements

HISTORY

Effective September 1, 2014, the following courses be introduced.

History 3204F/G - French Canada

An overview of the cultural, political, and economic history of French Canada since the Conquest of 1759. Particular attention will be paid to the growth of nationalism, the formation of identity, as well as the development of cultural, religious, and political institutions. Antirequisite(s): History 3203E Prerequisite(s): 1.0 History course at the 2200 level or above. 3 hours, 0.5 course.

History 3431F/G - Cities, Spaces and Minority Identities in Modern Europe: The Experiences of Jews and Muslims

Short title: Cities, Spaces, Minority Identities

This course focuses on the role of the city and urban spaces in the lives of religious and ethnic minorities in Europe during the 19th and 20th centuries. In particular, we will explore the experiences of Jews and Muslims in European society, as well as interactions between the two communities. Prerequisite(s): 1.0 Course in History at the 2200 level or above.

2 seminar hours, 0.5 course

History 3608F/G - Israel: People, Politics and Culture

The course introduces students to the varied nature of Israeli culture, society and politics. Beginning with an overview of Zionist ideology and mandate Palestine, the course explores the critical divisions in contemporary Israel: between secular and religious, Jews and Arabs, and Jews of different backgrounds. Prerequisite(s): 1.0 Course in History at the 2200 level or above. 2 seminar hours, 0.5 course

Effective September 1, 2014, History 3203E will be revised.

History 3203E - French Canada

Course description: No change. Antirequisite(s): History 3204F/G Prerequisite(s): 1.0 History course at the 2200 level or above. 3-lecture hours, 1.0 course.
