FACULTY OF EDUCATION

Effective **September 1, 2017**, the following courses be revised.

EDUC 5177Q/S Curriculum and Pedagogy in Elementary Social Studies

Theory and practice related to skills, attitudes, and understandings that support Social Studies education. This course takes a A critical approach to Social Studies education, emphasizing social action and interactive, hands-on, and constructivist learning. Skills, attitudes, and understandings that support Social Studies education, and effective pedagogical methods for teaching in increasingly diverse classrooms, are modelled and examined. Environmental and sustainability education is also addressed. Effective pedagogical methods for teaching in increasingly diverse classrooms are modelled and examined.

Two hours per week, .25 credit.

EDUC 5212 Curriculum and Pedagogy in Intermediate/Senior Geography

Curriculum and instruction in secondary school geography. A focus on curriculum design and approaches to teaching and learning including use of geotechnologies. Examination of resources, assessment and evaluation procedures, and current issues in geography and social science education. A focus on curriculum and approaches to the teaching and learning of geography. Resources, assessment and evaluation procedures, and current issues in geography and social science education, including the use of geotechnologies and the place of environmental and sustainability education, are discussed.

Four hours per week, full year, 1.0 credit.

EDUC 5214 Curriculum and Pedagogy in Intermediate/Senior Social Studies General Curriculum design and implementation for Individual and Society, a Contemporary Studies course in Ontario Secondary Schools. An introduction to curriculum and pedagogy in the Social Studies. A focus on instructional strategies, learning activities, resources, assessment and evaluation procedures, and current issues in contemporary social studies including environmental and sustainability education.

Four hours per week, full year, 1.0 credit

EDUC 5223 Curriculum and Pedagogy in Intermediate/Senior Science-General

An introduction to curriculum and pedagogy in science with particular focus on pedagogical practice and Ontario secondary school science curricula. Theoretical perspectives including the nature of science, cognitive, behavioural, and social theories of science learning, and adolescent development are examined. Significant attention is paid to environmental and sustainability education. An examination of theoretical perspectives in science teaching including the nature of science, cognitive, behavioural and social theories of science learning, and adolescent development. Ontario secondary science curricula are also examined.

Four hrs/week, full year, 1.0 credit

EDUC 5473Q/S Research in Intercultural Contexts

An exploration of ways to conduct small-scale exploratory research in intercultural contexts with particular sensitivity to cross-cultural dynamics. Teacher Candidates develop and carry out a small-scale, collaborative field study project over their final 3-4 week field placement, collaborating electronically and sharing their findings and emergent learnings in weekly seminars. To develop their capacities as prospective teacher researchers in intercultural contexts, Teacher Candidates explore culture and cross-cultural communication under conditions of heightened mobilities, global connections and colonial legacies. They learn to read cultural dynamics by examining anthropological, literary and media representations of culture, travel and encounter. Four hours per week, .25 credit.

PSYCHOLOGY

Psychology 4222F/G - Behavioral Pharmacology

Prerequisite(s): One of Psychology 2220A/B, 2210A/B or Neuroscience 2000, plus registration in third or fourth year Honors Specialization in Psychology, Honors Specialization in Developmental Cognitive Neuroscience, Honors Specialization in Neuroscience, Honors Specialization in Physiology/Psychology or Honors Specialization in Animal Behavior. Other Psychology students and Psychology Special Students who receive 70% in the prerequisite course(s) may enrol in this course.

Psychology 4223F/G - Brain, Behavior, and the Immune System

Prerequisite(s): Psychology 2220A/B, 2221A/B or Neuroscience 2000, and registration in third or fourth year Honors Specialization in Psychology, Honors Specialization in Developmental Cognitive Neuroscience, Honors Specialization in Neuroscience, Honors Specialization in Physiology/Psychology or Honors Specialization in Animal Behaviour. Other Psychology students and Psychology Special Students who receive 70% in the prerequisite course(s) may enrol in this course.

Psychology 4290F/G - Special Topics in Animal Behaviour and Animal Cognition

Prerequisite(s): Psychology 2220A/B or 2221A/B or Neuroscience 2000, and registration in third or fourth year Honors Specialization in Psychology, Honors Specialization in Developmental Cognitive Neuroscience, Honors Specialization in Neuroscience, Honors Specialization in Physiology/Psychology or Honors Specialization in Animal Behavior. Other Psychology students and Psychology Special Students who receive 70% in the prerequisite course(s) may enrol in this course.

Psychology 4295F/G - Special Topics in Behavioral and Cognitive Neuroscience

Prerequisite(s): Psychology 2220A/B, 2221A/B or Neuroscience 2000, and registration in third or fourth year Honors Specialization in Psychology, Honors Specialization in Developmental Cognitive Neuroscience, Honors Specialization in Neuroscience, Honors Specialization in Physiology/Psychology or Honors Specialization in Animal Behavior. Other Psychology students and Psychology Special Students who receive 70% in the prerequisite course(s) may enrol in this course.
