# Foods and Nutrition 1241A/B LIFECYCLE NUTRITION

A study of nutritional requirements from conception to senescence. Discussion of food habits and nutrition intervention programs in relation to the stages of the lifecycle.

Prerequisite(s): Foods and Nutrition 1070A/B or Foods and Nutrition 2070A/B or Foods and Nutrition 1030E or Foods and Nutrition 1021 or Foods and Nutrition 2121.

Extra Information: 3 lecture hours.

NOTE: This course will count as a Category C course for Brescia students and also main campus students who are enrolled in the Foods and Nutrition modules.
