Effective **September 1, 2010,** Brescia University College is to change the sections listed below to link directly to the Faculty of Arts and Humanities, main campus modules – as they will be changing them to have the same requirements as main campus.

INTERDISCIPLINARY STUDIES

Effective **March 1, 2011** withdraw the course Interdisciplinary Studies 1031 Exploring Leadership and introduce the course Dimensions of Leadership 1031 Exploring Leadership at Brescia University College.

Dimensions of Leadership 1031, Exploring Leadership

An interdisciplinary course providing students with an introduction to the concept and history of leadership. Students will examine the philosophical, psychological and theoretical perspectives on leadership through readings, engagement with representative leaders, and experiential simulations and activities. Antirequisite(s): former Interdisciplinary Studies 1031 3 lecture hours, 1.0 (Brescia)

Effective **March 1, 2011** Dimensions of Leadership module at Brescia University College be revised to remove Interdisciplinary Studies 1031 and add Dimensions of Leadership 1031.

MAJOR IN DIMENSIONS OF LEADERSHIP

Admission Requirements

Completion of first-year requirements with no failures. Students must have an average of at least 65% in 3.0 principal courses, including Dimensions of Leadership 1031 plus 2.0 additional courses, with no mark in these principal courses below 60%. At least 1.0 course in English, Management and Organizational Studies, History, Political Science, Psychology, or Sociology at the 1000 level is recommended in order to satisfy prerequisites for courses in the module.

POLITICAL SCIENCE

Effective **September 1, 2010** Political Science 2287A/B will be listed as a course available at Brescia University College.

This course conceptualizes politics as a set of interactive games and investigates the successful strategies for playing these games. The games, which students will play, include the prisoner's dilemma, chicken, stag hunt, ultimatum, and the dollar auction game. The course uses games to understand and resolve such key political situations as war, negotiations, overpopulation, and the provision of public goods. 3 lecture hours, 0.5 course (Brescia)

Effective **September 1, 2010** Political Science 2288A/B will be listed as a course available at Brescia University College.

Political Science 2288A/B – Odd Government

This course uses simulations and class-based experiments to explore models of how government decides and acts. The models include the rational actor model, bureaucratic politics, punctuated equilibrium theory, backward mapping, and the psychology of choice. The course emphasizes the unexpected or odd nature of much of government behavior.

3 lecture hours, 0.5 course (Brescia)

Effective **September 1, 2010** Political Science 3392E will be listed as a course available at Brescia University College. The course is currently available at Huron University College and King's University College

3392E – Selected Topics in Political Science

Prerequisite(s): Enrolment in 3rd or 4th year Politics, or permission of the Department for students not registered in Politics programs.

3 lecture hours, 1.0 course (Brescia, Huron, King's)

SOCIOLOGY AND FAMILY STUDIES

Effective **September 1, 2011** the stipulation of limited enrolment, will be added to the Admission Requirements of the following program and module at Brescia University College:

In the Calendar page for the Honors Specialization in Community Rural Health Development (p. 369), the following text is to be added to the end of the Admission Requirements paragraph:

"Enrolment in this module is limited. Meeting the minimum requirements does not guarantee that students wishing to transfer into this module will be offered enrolment."

FACULTY OF HEALTH STUDIES

HEALTH STUDIES

That effective **September 1, 2010** the antirequisites to Health Sciences 2801A/B be amended to include similar methods courses offered by Sociology, Psychology and Social Work.

Health Sciences 2801A/B: Research Methods in Health Sciences

An introduction to the design of health sciences research, providing students with knowledge relevant to the planning and evaluation of research in both laboratory and applied settings. Prerequisite(s): Health Sciences 1001A/B and 1002A/B, or the former Health Sciences 1000. Antirequisite(s): Psychology 2800E or 2820E or 2840F/G, or Sociology 2206A/B, or Social Work 2205. 2 lecture hours, 1 laboratory hour, 0.5 course

FACULTY OF SOCIAL SCIENCE

ECONOMICS

That effective September 1, 2010 a new essay course Economics 3363F/G (Political Economy I) will be created.

ECONOMICS 3363F/G – Political Economy I

This essay course will provide a survey of major contributions to political economy including voting, the functions of democratic institutions, bureaucracy and dictatorship. Antirequisite(s): Economics 3368A/B Prerequisite(s): Economics 2150A/B, or 2260A/B. 3 Lecture Hours, 0.5 course.

That effective **September 1, 2010** Economics 4496F/G will be created as a new Special Topics essay course number.

ECONOMICS 4496F/G – Special Topics in Economics V

An analysis of current topics in Economics. Prerequisite(s): Economics 2221A/B, 2223A/B, and 2261A/B or the permission of the Department. 3 Lecture Hours, 0.5 course.

RICHARD IVEY SCHOOL OF BUSINESS

MIT/HBA COMBINED PROGRAM

That effective **September 1, 2010** the MIT/HBA Combined program will be updated to include revisions to the HBA program implemented in the Fall of 2009. Proposal also affects minor revisions to the requirements in years four and five of the combined program.

Revised Calendar Copy:

Admission Requirements

Students apply for the combined program during their HBA1 year. Admission to the combined program is competitive and limited. Students must complete all requirements for the first two years of the Honors Specialization in MIT, obtain a minimum two year average of 80% with no failures, and achieve a minimum 70% in Business Administration 2257. Demonstrated participation in extracurricular and/or community activities, leadership and work experience are also admission criteria. Students applying to the Ivey Business School's Advanced Entry Opportunity (AEO) are also eligible to be considered for the combined program.

Year One

Completion of first-year requirements with no failures. All 5.0 first-year courses will be considered as principal courses. Students must have an average of at least 72% in these principal courses, including Media, Information and Technoculture 1200F/G, 1500F/G and 1700F/G with a mark of at least 70% in each, with no mark in any course below 60%.

Year Two

* Media, Information and Technoculture 2000F/G, 2100F/G, 2200F/G, 2500A/B, Writing 2121F/G

- * 1.0 Media, Information and Technoculture courses at the 2000 level or higher
- * Business Administration 2257.
- * 0.5 course equivalent option.

Year Three (HBA1)

The third year of the undergraduate program in Business Administration consists of an integrated set of courses (8.25) designed to give a basic understanding of the functions and the interrelationships of the major areas of management, as well as to develop problem-solving and action-planning skills.

All students will take: Business Administration 3300K, 3301K, 3303K, 3304K, 3307K, 3311K, 3316K, 3321K, 3322K, 3323K.

No substitute for any of the above courses is permitted under any circumstances.

Years 4 and 5 (HBA 2 Requirements can be taken over year 4 or 5 – no course is restricted to either year) 2.0 courses:

International Perspective Requirement: Business Administration 4505A/B – Global Environment of Business

• Corporations and Society Perspective Requirement: at least one 0.5 course from Business 4521A/B, 4522A/b, 4523A/B or other business elective as determined and approved by the HBA Program Director to satisfy this requirement.

• Applied Project Requirement: At least one of Ivey Consulting Project Business Administration 4430 (1.0 credit) or Ivey New Venture Project Business Administration 4410 (1.0 credit).

5.0 additional business elective credits.

Years 4 and 5 (Media, Information and Technoculture Requirements)

1.0 Media, Information and Technoculture 3000A/B, 3100F/G (must be taken in fourth year)

2.5 Media, Information and Technoculture courses at the 2000 level or higher.

1.5 Media, Information and Technoculture courses at the 3000 level or higher

0.5 course from Media, Information and Technoculture 4030F/G – 4039F/G (must be taken in fifth year)
